Keynote Speaker: Representative Jerrold Nadler (NY-08)

Congressman Nadler will conclude the day's program with a keynote speech providing an insider's perspective on the legislative process that resulted in the passage of the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008. He was first elected to the House of Representatives in 1992 after serving for 16 years in the New York State Assembly. He was re-elected to his seventh full term in 2004 with a resounding 80 percent of the vote. Throughout his career he has championed civil rights, civil liberties, efficient transportation, and a host of progressive issues such as access to health care, support for the arts and protection of the Social Security system. He is considered an unapologetic defender of those who might otherwise be forgotten by American law or the economy, and is respected specifically for his creative and pragmatic legislative approaches. He serves on both the House Judiciary Committee and the House Transportation Committee.
